- Please can you provide the following information:
- Does the Trust have a contract of any kind in place with any agency for the provision of temporary non-medical and non-clinical workers?
  - If yes to the above question, who is the contract with, when was the contract awarded and when does it expire?
- How much did the Trust spend on agency workers falling into the category of non-medical and non-clinical for the period April 2022 to March 2023 & the period April 2023 to March 2024?
- Who would be responsible for awarding a temporary staffing contract for the Trust, please could you confirm the full name of the individual and their position and role within the organisation?
